# Voluntary Certification of Fire Protection Equipment Technicians

Senate Bill 355 of the 2004 legislative session was signed by the governor on May 24, 2004 with an effective date of January 1, 2005. The bill created an advisory committee to advise and assist the Department of Safety with the development of rules for implementation of the system. The bill amended RSA 153:5 by adding 153:5-a and 153:5-b.

RSA 153:5-a gives the commissioner of the Department of Safety the authority to adopt rules pursuant to RSA 541-A for the voluntary certification of persons involved in the inspection, installation and servicing of:

- Portable Fire Extinguishers
- Fixed Fire Extinguishing Systems (Hood Systems and special hazards)
- Fire Sprinkler Systems
- Fire Alarm and Detection Systems.

RSA 153:5-b establishes the advisory committee with representation from:

- The sprinkler industry
- The NH Plumbing and Mechanical Contractors Association
- The portable fire extinguisher industry.
- The fixed fire protection system industry.
- The NH Association of Fire Chiefs
- The NH Fire Prevention Society
- The Electrical Contractors Business Association
- The NH Municipal Association.
- The NH Electricians' Board

The inaugural meeting of the committee was held on January 19, 2005 at the Richard M. Flynn Fire Academy in Concord. The committee met nearly every month and through the tireless efforts of the committee members and their alternates, the rules were approved effective in November 2010.

The NH Department of Safety and the Department of Information Technology are currently working on the infrastructure to accept and manage the application process within the next few months. The rules sets forth the education, training and work experience required for each endorsement of the certification. The current level of training includes such programs as US Dept of Labor approved courses on automatic sprinkler systems, American Fire Sprinkler Association, National Fire Sprinkler Association, International Code Council/National Association of Fire Equipment Distributors, National Institute for the Certifica-

tion of Engineering Technicians, Underwriter's Laboratories approved programs, Factory Mutual approved programs, Brooks Equipment Company program, Automatic Fire Alarm Association, International Municipal Signal Association, and the Electronic Security Association.

The program will provide a statewide level playing field for those persons in the industry. Currently there is no regulation on persons in this trade. We have now established the bar for all contractors to voluntarily achieve.

# The Fire Service as a Valuable Partner in Information Sharing and Fusion Processes\*

The Fire Service is in a unique position to aid their public safety partners by sharing information and reporting suspicious activity observed in the normal course of daily activities. Fusion centers across the country have recognized the value that non-law enforcement partners, including the fire service and private sector, bring to recognizing and reporting suspicious activity. This added value in integrating the fire service in the information sharing processes ensures that accurate and timely information is shared with the appropriate entities and can be supported through the following lessons learned:

- Assign a fire service representative to the fusion center to establish communication lines, identify information requirements, and ensure information is shared back and forth. *The NH Information and Analysis Center envisions this happening in 2011.*
- Develop policies, procedures and applicable training to ensure suspicious activity and other information observed by the fire service as part of their daily activities is handled and shared in the appropriate way, including protecting privacy and civil liberties. *The NH Information and Analysis Center is working on developing policy/procedure for this.*
- Consider implementing a Fusion Liaison Officer Program with standard training on identifying indicators and warnings and reporting suspicious activities. This program provides standard training for law enforcement and multi-

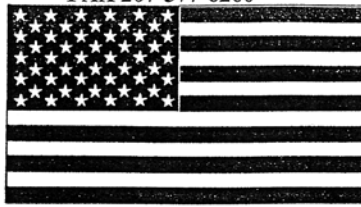
disciplinary partners, including fire service, to coordinate and share information with a fusion center, as well as their respective roles and responsibilities. This includes what they can and cannot do to stay within the bounds of applicable privacy laws, i.e., reporting information observed in plain view and in the course of their normal duties, while emphasizing the fact that they are not analysts. *The NH Information and Analysis Center is developing an Intelligence Liaison Officer Program to be implemented in 2011 with LE, Fire, Hazmat, Campus LE, Public Health and other disciplines as the program is further refined. We will provide more information on this in the coming months.*

- Establish procedures to provide feedback to all tips/leads to promote continued participation. The participation of a fire service representative in the NH Information and Analysis Center will further facilitate the sharing of information between the fusion center, law enforcement and the fire service.

The NH Information and Analysis Center has begun to have discussions with the fire service on how to incorporate them into the Center and share information.

# Meeting Minutes

## Minutes of a Meeting of the NH Association of Fire Chiefs

January 13, 2011 - Valentino's Restaurant – Hudson, NH

Called to order at 1828 hours by President Murray.

Following a salute to the flag, and a moment of silence, a quorum call was taken.

Host Chief Shawn Murray welcomed all to Hudson and thanked everyone for attending. He introduced Selectman/NH House Deputy Majority Leader Shawn Jasper. He asked for cooperation and constructive suggestions on solving the Retirement System financial issues.

There were no Advocate Members present.

Minutes of the previous meeting: A **MOTION** (Christopoulos/O'Keefe) to accept them as printed carried unanimously.

Deputy Carrier presented the financial report. A **MOTION** (O'Keefe/Mason) to accept it as printed, carried unanimously.

Applications: There one application for membership in First Reading.

Chief Murray reported on:

- Crotched Mt. Christmas Party a big success in December. At least 25 NHAFC members attended.
- Chief Silver submitted his report on EMS recertification process.
- Commissioner announced the 2010 grant period is open. Dept. of Safety website has more info.
- Officers met with Commissioner Barthelmes on the process to take place in choosing a replacement for FST Director Richard Mason who will retire in February.
- PRIMEX will run their Leadership in Risk Management program again. Sign up for participation is on going.
- Senator Shaheen will be meeting with Fire Chiefs tomorrow in Hudson.

Chief Fraitzl, Chair of the Legislative Committee reported on the proposed bylaw comments. The Board will be taking a look at the comments next month.

Chief Murray reported on the legislation that has been forthcoming and efforts to address them. Chief McCaffrie reported on his testimony on an ambulance reimbursement bill.

Chief Christopoulos reported on the bill to honor the memory of 9/11.

Chief Murray mentioned efforts to repeal the Evergreen Bill and the bill determining the size of Collective Bargaining units

Chief Burkush spoke on the efforts of the Retirement Coalition. They are making talking points and looking for legislators that will work with them. There is concern over the proposed changes that may be put forth.

Chiefs Thibeault and Lambert completed their study of the Statewide Fire Mobilization Plan. Chief Murray displayed the report.

J. William Degnan, State Fire Marshal, reported that the State Fire Code update has been completed and a presentation will be made before the Building Code Review Board. JLCAR will be reviewing it shortly. He reported on several incidents where smoke detector batteries have not been in place. He also reported on incidents at Proctor Academy (ventilation issue) where the Fire Department was not notified. The point made was that ice rinks should not operate if air handling systems are inoperable. He also reported on a couple of bills at the Federal level that should be addressed (sprinkler and arsonist registry bills). He also spoke of a bill filed that would remove the Fire Code from construction consideration.

Director Mason, for Fire Training and EMS, reported that Recruit School will be starting on the 26<sup>th</sup> of March. He introduced Clay O'Dell as the new Chief of EMS. He offered comments and information and affirmed information presented earlier on the EMT refresher activities. They are working their way through the disciplinary process and also EMS protocols that will be forthcoming.

Chief Murray reported on the unfortunate accident experienced by Chief Lyon of New London. He is doing well and recuperating.

Marty Carrier reported that the past Congress never passed and LOSAP legislation and he is hoping to have the next session act on this.

Director of Homeland Security Chris Pope added information on the Proctor Academy incident.

Chief Brad Simpkins reported on the extensive fire activity experienced in 2010 due to a dry season. He also reported

on efforts to upgrade wildland fire reporting, and also online licensing and permitting efforts. He is looking for volunteers for a pilot project related to these efforts.

Chief Christopoulos for the NEDIAFC, reported on upcoming meetings and planning activities for the Springfield conference. He will be replacing Chief Carrier on the Government Option and Purchasing Committee.

Chief Morrill for the NEAFC will provide more info on the Springfield conference next meeting.

Under New Business, Chief Murray asked that members wish Marty Carrier a Happy Birthday.

Next meeting will be in Northwood on February 10.

A motion to adjourn as made and seconded at 1925 hours.
